- Self-sustaining, collaborative model (not grant funded)

TSP Support Structure

Collaboration with faculty and Accessibility Resources Center (ARC)

Faculty informed that TSP student and Ed Coach is enrolled in their course (info sheet)

Students register with ARC for accommodations for the semester

Closely coordinate with ARC and the Academic Achievement Center (AAC)

Most students meet with peer tutors and learning specialists in the AAC regularly

Coordinator's role: Program admission Academic advisor Supervises Ed Coaches Weekly meetings with students (semester goals/PCP, student progress, problem solve) School district liaison Promote student engagement

Campus-Wide vs. Program-Specific Support

Campus-wide: Accessibility accommodations, student activities, advising Program-specific: Ed Coach support, course materials provided, weekly meetings with coordinator

Help families understand and navigate both layers of support

Educational Coaches

Hired (\$30/hr), on-going training, and supervised by program staff

Help provide academic and social support on campus

Attend class with student

Meet regularly with student (up to 10 hrs/wk)



Collaborate with local high schools, MAIPSE and DDS

Partnerships with Schools & Agencies



Facilitate contracts and align goals with sending districts



Share progress and updates with all stakeholders
